


SUMMERTIME TOYS

- 1 pkg of flour tortillas
- 1 pkg of cream cheese
- 2 cups shredded sharp cheddar cheese

Soften cream cheese to room temperature. Mix together cream cheese, cheddar cheese, olives & salsa.

Spread onto tortillas, being careful not to overfill. Roll-up, slice into 1" pieces, and refrigerate. Serve chilled!

Annual Notice of Privacy Policy

I. Purpose

The Town & Country Insurance Agency has implemented this privacy policy because our goal of the agency/ customer relationship is the customer's trust in this agency and because we have an affirmative and continuing obligation to respect the privacy of our customers and to protect the security and confidentiality of the customers' non-public personal information. This policy applies only to nonpublic personal information (NPI) about individuals who obtain products or services primarily for personal, family or household purposes.

II. Guidelines

We collect NPI about consumers from the following sources:


Information we receive from the consumer on applications or other forms, such as name, address, social security number, and date of birth; Information about the consumer's transactions with us, our affiliates, or others, such as account balances, payment history, health information; Information we receive from a consumer-reporting agency, such as creditworthiness, credit history and driving record.

We do not disclose any NPI about our customers or former customers to anyone, except as described in Section III. of this policy. If a customer decides to close their account(s) or become an inactive customer, we will adhere to the privacy policies and practices as described in this policy.

We restrict access to NPI about our customers to those employees who need to know that information to provide products or services to the customers. We maintain physical, electronic and procedural safeguards that comply with Federal standards to guard nonpublic personal information.

III. Exceptions

We may disclose NPI we collect to companies that perform marketing services on our behalf or to other institutions with whom we have joint marketing agreements. We may disclose NPI we collect as necessary to effect, administer or enforce a transaction that the consumer requests or authorizes. We may disclose NPI we collect as permitted by law.

Garden of Life (& Health)



Barb, Jeni & Holly from our Life & Health Department share their favorite summertime wellness activity... gardening! It's no surprise that gardening has proven to be therapeutic & beneficial to your overall wellness (physically and mentally.) And after the first half of 2020, what better way to bring in the summer than enjoying the peace & beauty found in the garden!

Did you know? Chives, mint, sage, rosemary, oregano, thyme, tarragon, winter savory, lemon balm and

horseradish are perennial herbs and come back year after year without replanting. Parsley will come back every 2 years (biennial). Holly says "I tend to plant my herbs in pots so I can bring them inside throughout the winter and continue to utilize them in my cooking."

Cucumbers are a favorite of Holly's as she likes to pickle them. Cucumbers are best grown by beans, corn, peas, tomatoes and radishes. You should also grow your cucumbers in an area where they will get morning sun, which helps to dry off the dew and prevent mold/rot. Make sure to keep your cucumbers away from your potatoes as this can contribute to potato blight, however are companions with marigolds. Companion planting with marigolds helps to create larger cucumbers with fewer pests and diseases.











Barb also uses Marigolds in her garden. "I never buy them but still enjoy these annuals each year because I dry the seeds each fall. You simply let the blossom get dry and brown, then remove seeds from the pod, lay on a tray for a week or two, and finally

just store in a cool place. This is so easy and marigolds are such fun to put in pots, containers, or use in the garden. The seeds can also make fun little gifts to give away."

Barb is pictured standing among her Stella D'Oro daylilies. "I bought

about 10 of these perennial daylilies over 20 years ago as I like that they last a long time after peaking early to mid-July. Since then, I have divided so many times that I cannot count how many I now have. What I find really pleasurable is giving divisions away to family and friends for their own gardens."
